DEDICATION OF MARKER AT GRAVE OF ROGER WILLIAMS

Among the 80 Governors who have served the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations since the 17th century, Roger Williams served as Chief Officer under the Charter from September 1644 to May 1647. The State furnished a bronze marker for the grave of each of these Governors. On July 4, 1954 the Roger Williams Family Association had the honor of dedicating the marker for Roger Williams' grave in the beautiful park on Prospect Terrace, Providence, where, high above the city he founded, his statue now stands. This was placed there in 1936, 300 years after his arrival in this state. Our President, Mrs. Clifford W. Brown, acted as Program Director, assisted by the Vice-President, Miss Clara P. Dyer, and the Chaplain, Mrs. Bertha Williams Anthony. The marker was unveiled by two of our Junior members, Clifford W. Brown, Jr. and Miss Lois Steere. The principal speaker was Charles R. Wood, Administrative Assistant to Honorable Walter H. Reynolds, Mayor of Providence.

Roger Williams' own words, found in his book "The Key to the Indian Language" were used in the benediction:

"Now to the most High and most Holy, Immortall, Invisible, and onely Wise God, who alone is Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and the Ending, the First and the Last; who Was and Is, and Is to Come; from Whom, by Whom, and to Whom are all things; by Whose gracious assistance and whomerfull supportment in so many varieties of hardship and outward miseries we have been mercifully assisted, be Honour, Glory, Power, Riches, Wisdome, Goodnesse and Dominion ascribed by all His in Jesus Christ to Eternity, AMEN."

The Rhode Island Jewish Tercentenary committee extended a cordial invitation to the members of our Association to attend a special celebration on September 14. 1954 at the Roger Williams Spring in the afternoon, and Veteran's Memorial Auditorium in the evening, at which time two original books written by Roger Williams were presented to the Rhode Island Historical Society as a "token of appreciation for all that Roger Williams has meant for the religious freedom of all people." These are very rare books which the Rhode Island Historical Society has been most eager to have as part of their Roger Williams collection. The titles are "Queries of Highest Consideration" and "The Hireling Ministry-None of Christ's." A delegation from our association was present at these exercises.
