Fellow Members:

Greetings to our family group and a special welcome to the 43 new members who have joined during the past year.

I would like to comment on a bill which is being introduced in the House and Senate in Washington regarding a four acre piece of land including the site of the Roger Williams spring on North Main Street, Providence, R. I. It is desired that this be established as a Roger Williams National Memorial Park; the old buildings cleared away and the section beautified. This spring site, the spot where the Colony of Providence was founded "with full liberty in religious concernments", was the spot where the Colony of Providence Plantations was founded by Roger Williams. He became an important national figure and his beliefs in religious liberty for all men gave to the Rhode Island Colony a preeminent place of leadership, not only in the Colonies but all of Europe as well. Our Corresponding Secretary has written letters to committee members of Congress asking their co-operation in the establishment of this Park. This bill was first introduced in 1960 but it has remained in committee ever since, because of the expenditure involved. It has recently been revived, and we hope with success.

Because we have received several inquiries as to whether Josephine Williams, the mother of Barry Goldwater, is a descendant of Roger Williams, we wrote Senator Goldwater in April asking for verification, and his reply was as follows:

"As a member of the Sons of the American Revolution, I have, some place in my files, a line going back on the Williams side of my family. And, as soon as I have a moment, I'll try and find it as I too have always been interested in my mother's statements that her family descended from the illustrious Roger Williams.

"Frankly, I couldn't prove it without that document, and as my memory serves me, it isn't too clear on the matter. But, I will surely try to help in

any way that I can.

BETSY WILLIAMS COTTAGE IN ROGER WILLIAMS PARK

Roger Williams Park in Providence contains 453 acres of expertly landscaped woodland and about 140 acres of natural and artificial lakes. Ten miles of well-kept roads and magnificent floral displays attract thousands of out-of-state visitors yearly.

Many people are of the opinion that Betsy Williams was either the wife or daughter of the Founder of Providence. Her father was James³, son of Nathanael⁴ (James³, Joseph², Roger¹). Nathanael built the quaint little cottage in 1773, where Betsy was born in 1790. Through her generosity Providence acquired a great wilderness far out in the country (5 miles from the City) upon her death in 1871, at the age of 82. According to her will, this great tract must be used for a public purpose and named in honor of her ancestor. In the quaint red building, still standing and bearing her name, a large fireplace, twice the size of many kitchenettes, dominates one side of the room which was once used for kitchen, dining room and living room. Four rooms, including a large pantry, are downstairs, with three bedrooms upstairs. Through the generosity of two public citizens, Mrs. Murray Danforth and Mr. Henry D. Sharpe, \$5,000 was spent in 1962 on the restoration of this cottage. Betsy also left money in her will for a statue for Roger Williams, located in the graveyard there.
