Roger Williams came to the New World, at the age of 26, to escape religious persecution in England. He said that he pondered bitterly over the "monstrous paradox that God's children should so persecute God's children". He was the first American who offered a refuge to the persecuted races and religions of the world. While Quakers were being imprisoned and hanged in Massachusetts, Roger Williams allowed them to live unmolested in Rhode Island. And when the Jews were being driven out of Europe, and were refused a home even in the American Dutch colony of New Amsterdam, it was Roger Williams who welcomed them to his colony and allowed them to build a community and a synagogue at Newport.
