ROGER WILLIAMS

"Roger Williams was a century in advance of the world in his views of government and religion, and he laid the foundation of religious freedom for the American people. He was the first person to put these ideas into real action when he founded Rhode Island, the first place in the world where there was complete religious freedom for every man who sought it and without the state interfering. He lived in truth, and applied it with sincerity, and THAT WAS THE GREATNESS OF ROGER WILLIAMS.

"From his many hardships and experiences, Roger Williams had gradually developed a keen intellect, but was no mystic, no solitary thinker, nor did theology concern him. He took HIS stand on the Holy Bible.

"Roger Williams earned his living by farming, and by trading with the Indians, learning their language and customs, while he also served as Missionary to them. Trading fairly with them, the Indians came to trust him, and him alone. He consistently preached against the Colonists taking lands from the Indians without paying for them. He entered into a treaty with Massasoit and other Indian Chiefs, which later laid the foundations for Rhode Island and Providence Plantations."
