

### SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2024 - 11:00 AM TOUR OF VARNHAM HOUSE MUSEUM

Varnham House Museum Mansion, overlooking Greenwich Bay in East Greenwich, was built by James Mitchell Varnum on a large plot of land he had purchased in 1773 for \$90. Varnum was a talented young lawyer and a prominent figure in the Revolutionary War and early American politics. He attracted a "Who's Who" of guests to his mansion, including George Washington, Rochambeau, John Sullivan, Nathaniel Greene and more. Varnam House was constructed by master builder John Reynolds in keeping with the best architectural standards of the late 18th century. The museum's exhibits focus on early American furniture, household items, musical instruments, children's toys, documents, paintings and many items from the Far East. Tour cost is \$10 per person. Following our tour, we will meet at Chelo's Waterfront for lunch.

GPS: Varnham House Museum, 57 Pierce Street, East Greenwich, Rl. Directions: From Route 95 South, bear left onto Route 4 South. Exit onto Route 401 East (Division Street). In about one mile stay straight, following Division Street (do not bear right following Route 401). After 0.7 miles, turn right onto Pierce Street. Continue to the Varnum House at 57 Pierce Street.

#### SATURDAY, OCTOBER 5, 2024 - 11:00 AM BIANNUAL PILGRIMAGE TO ROGER WILLIAMS SHELTER

We will assemble on the straight dirt road off Birch Swamp Road, Warren, Rl and travel by car to within several hundred yards of the large rock shelter known as Margaret's Rock in North Swansea, MA. Margaret was a Wamponoag Medicine Woman who helped Roger return to good health, along with the help of Massasoit, following Roger's banishment from the Massachusetts Bay Colony in that extremely cold winter of 1636. It is the only abode which exists today in the Providence area whose walls Roger actually touched. Let us pay homage to this temporary and first home in the wilderness for Roger during the 14 weeks immediately after his banishment. Please arrive 30 minutes early to carpool and/or caravan. The rain date will be Sunday, October 6th at 1:00pm. Bring a folding chair and packed lunch for a short meeting afterwards.

Directions: From Providence, take I-195 toward Swansea and Fall River; take the Rt. 136 exit and travel south 1.7 miles; after crossing into RI, turn left onto Birch Swamp Rd.; continue for 0.3 miles where road takes a 90 degree turn, and go straight onto the dirt road (sign "Windswept Farm"; DO NOT turn right into the drive to the Old Chase Farm). We will assemble on this dirt road, drive to within several hundred yards, and hike up to the rock from there.

#### SUNDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2024 - 11:00 AM FOUNDER'S DAY SERVICE AT FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH

We will meet for the annual Founder's Day Service at First Baptist Church in Providence and join in the celebration of their 386th anniversary. We will then gather at the Betsy Williams cottage in Roger Williams Park to enjoy a self-tour of the building's exterior, view the nearby Roger Williams statue, and walk through the Joseph Williams burial grounds. Please bring a folding chair and a picnic lunch. Should the weather not cooperate, after church we will meet at Chelo's at 505 Silver Spring Avenue in Providence for lunch.

### SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 16, 2024 - 11:00 AM TOUR OF PAINE HOUSE MUSEUM

The Paine House Museum is operated by the Western Rhode Island Civic Historical Society as a former colonial home and inn. The original part of the house is thought to have been built as early as 1691 by Samuel Bennett, who was known to operate a sawmill on the nearby Pawtuxet River. We will meet in the adjacent Mruk Fire Alarm Building for a short meeting and a talk by Charlotte Carrington-Farmer on Roger and Mary Williams. This will be followed by a house tour (\$6 per person). For those interested in lunch, directions will be given to the nearby Old Theatre Diner located at 33 Sandy Bottom Road, Coventry.

#### SATURDAY, APRIL 19, 2025 - 11:00 AM TOUR OF JOHN WATERMAN ARNOLD HOUSE

A short business meeting will be held at the John Waterman Arnold House followed by a tour of this interesting old house built around 1790, now home to the Warwick Historical Society. John Waterman Arnold was a descendent of William Arnold, Richard Waterman, and Roger Williams through daughter, Mercy. We will gather after our tour at nearby Governor Francis Inn at 1251 Warwick Avenue (directions will be provided).

GPS: John Waterman Arnold House, 25 Roger Williams Circle, Warwick, Rl. Directions: From Rte. 95 North or South take the Route 37 East exit. Travel all the way to the end, following signs to Post Road North. Follow Post Road North, noting Walmart on your right. At traffic light, turn right onto Atlantic Avenue. At next traffic light, turn right onto Warwick Avenue. Take second left onto Harrison Avenue and follow for 0.3 miles. Turn right onto Roger Williams Avenue.

#### SATURDAY, MAY 3, 2025 - 11:00 AM TOUR OF HEARTHSIDE MANSION

Built in 1810, this unique stone mansion is located on Great Road, the first road built through the wilderness between Providence and Mendon, MA and one of the oldest thoroughfares in America. Hearthside, also known as "The House that Love Built," is one of the finest examples of 19th century federal-style houses in the state and is on the National Register of Historic Places. The land on which Hearthside was built was originally owned by Roger Williams. A brief meeting will follow the tour, then lunch at The Lodge Pub & Eatery at 40 Breakneck Hill Road (directions will be provided).

Just as Breakneck Hill levels off, at the intersection of Great Road, there will be a farm with twin silos on your left; immediately after the silos is Hearthside. From Rte. 295 take Exit 9A onto Rte. 146 toward Lincoln. Take the Rte. 123/Breakneck Hill Road exit. Turn left onto Rte. 123E. At the bottom of the hill, Breakneck Hill Road becomes Great Road. You will see twin silos on your left and Hearthside is right after them.

### SATURDAY, JUNE 21, 2025 - 12:00 PM VISIT TO FOUNDER'S BROOK

In old records, Founder's Brook was known as the "watering place" and was later called "Stony Brook." Today it is called "Founder's Brook," a place set aside to remember the founders, the Portsmouth Compact, and the early roots of Portsmouth life where Anne Hutchinson and her followers helped settle the colony on land Roger Williams helped them to secure from the Native Americans. Bring a chair and picnic lunch and enjoy the peaceful setting.

# ROGER WILLIAMS AND THE SETTLEMENT AT PROVIDENCE FROM RWFA ANNUAL BULLETIN NO. 78 1991-1992

"Be it Knowne unto all men by these presentes, That I Roger Williams of the Towne of Providence in the Narragansett Bay in New England having in the Yeare one Thousand six hundred Thirtye ffoure And in the Yeare one Thousand six Hundred Thirtye ffive, had severall Treatyes with Counanicusse And Miantenome, the Two chiefe Sachims of the Narragansett; And in the End purchased of them the Landes and Meddows upon the Two ffresh Rivers called Moshosick, and Wanasquatuckett The Two said Sachims having by A Deede under theire handes, Two Yeares after the sale thereof Established, And Conffirmed the Boundes of those Landes ffrom the River And ffields of Pautuckett, the Great Hill of Neotaconkonitt on the Norwest And the Towne of Mashapaug on the west; Notwithstanding, I had the frequent promise of Miantenomy (my kind freind) that It should not be Land that I should want about these Boundes mentioned, provided, that I satisffied the Indian; there inhabeting; I having made Covenants of peaceable neighbourhood with all the Sachims, And Natives Round about us, And having in A sence of God's mercifful Providence unto me in my destresse, call the place Providence, I desired it might be A shelter for persons destressed for Conscience; I then considering the condition of Divers of my destressed countrey men; I comunicated my said purchase unto my loving ffriends, John Throckmorton, William Arnold, William Harris, Stuckley Westcott, John Greene Senior, Thomas Olney Senior, Richard Watermane And others, who then desired to take Shelter here with me, And in Succession, unto so many others as we Should Receive into the felloship, And Societye of injoyeing, And desposing of the Said Purchase: And besides the FFirst that were admitted, our Towne Recordes declare, that afterwards wee Received Chad Brown, William ffield, Thomas Harris Senior, William Wickenden, Robert Williams, Grigorey Dexter, and others as our Towne Booke declares: And whereas by Gode's Mercifull Assistance I was the procurer of the purchase not by monies nor payment, the Natives being so shy, And jeloues that monies could not do it, but by that Language, Aquaintance, And favour with the Natives, And other Advantages which it pleased God to give me, And also bore the charges, And Venture of all the Gratuetyes which I gave to the great Sachims, And other Sachims And Natives Round about us: And Lay engaged for A Loving and pecable Neighbourhood with them all, to my great charge, And Travell; It was therefore Thought fitt by some Loving ffriends, that I should Receive Some Loving consideration And gratuetye; And it was agreed between us That Every person that should be Admitted into the ffelloship of injoyeing Land And desposing of the purchase should pay Thirtye Shillings unto a Publique stock; And ffirst about Thirtye pounds should be paid unto myselfe, by Thirtye Shillings A person, as They were Admitted: This Sum I received, And in Love to my ffriendes, And with Respect to A Towne, And

place of Succor for the destressed as aforesaid, I doe Acknowledg the Said Sum, And payment, as ffull Sattisffaction; And whereas in the yeare one Thousand six hundred Thirtye seauen (so called) I delivered the deede subscribed by the Two Aforesaid cheife Sachims (so much thereof as concerneth the aforementioned Landes) ffrom my selfe, And from my heires, unto the whole number of the purchasers, with all my powre, Right, And Title therein: Reserving only unto myselfe, one Single Share Equal unto any of the Rest of thast number, I now Againe, in A more fformal way under my hand and Seale conffirme my fformer Resignation of that Deede of the Lands aforsaid; And Bind my selfe, my heirs, my Exsecutors, my Administerators, And Assignes, never to molest any of the said persons Already Received, or hereafter to be Received into the Society of purchasers as aforsaid: But that they, theire heirs, Exsecutors, Administerators, And Assignes Shall at all tymes quietly, And pecably Injoy the premises, And Every part thereof; And I doe ffurther by these presentes, Bind my selfe, my heirs, Exsecutors, my Administerators, And Assignes never to Lay any claime, nor cause any claime to be Laid to any of the Lands aforementioned, or unto any part, or parcell thereof, (more than unto my owne Single Share) by Vertue, or pretence of any fformer Bargine, Sale, or Morgage, what So ever; (or jointers, Thirdes, or Intailes) made by me the said Roger Williams, or of any other person Either ffor, By, Through, or under me In Wittnesse thereof I have hereunto Sett my hand and Seall This Twentyeth day of December, in this presant yeare One Thousand Six hundred Sixty one.

Memorandum the wordes: of the purchase was interlined before these presantes was Sealed Roger Williams,

Signed, Sealed And Delivered in the presence of us Thomas Smith Joseph Carpenter

It would seem from this deed that the first twelve proprietors were admitted into equal ownership of the lands with Roger Williams without being required to furnish any equivalent for the value of the lands received, and that the thirty pounds which were paid Roger Williams from the common fund created by the payment of thirty shillings by each of the succeeding settlers was not paid as an equivalent for the land, but was accepted by him as "a loving gratuity," and that "all which he received was far less than what he had expended."

For the lands on the Pawtuxet river Mr. Williams received twelve-thirteenths of twenty pounds from the twelve persons named in the deed of October 8, 1638.

The lands thus transferred by Roger Williams to his associates were divided into two parts, which were known as "the grand purchase of Providence and the Pautuxet purchase."
