"In 1632, Roger Williams, an inhabitant of the Plymouth Colony, did much to win the friendship of the Indians for the white man, gaining sufficient familiarity with their tongue which enabled him afterward to write his "Key Into the Language of America." His services as agent to the Indians were important in the Colony. Love of the red men led him to express the belief that title to the land could not be derived from the King's grant. He asserted that it must be secured by purchase from the natives — a view unacceptable to the company leaders of Massachusetts Bay Colony who based their right to the land upon their grant from the King."
