"QUERIES OF HIGHEST CONSIDERATION"—clear-cut enunication of the separation of Church and State. This book is in the R. I. Historical Sectety, Providence, R. I. The only other known copies of this FIRST edition are in the British Museum and the John Carter Brown Library, Providence.

"THE HIRELING MINISTRY NONE OF CHRIST'S"—written 1652 to persuade Cromwell and Parliament to abolish the payment of tithes for support of clergy and thus to establish freedom of religion. Presented to Rhode Island Historical Society in observance of American Jewish Tercentenary in 1954.

The Roger Williams Family Association through its Lineage Book Committee is at work on a new "Roger Williams of Providence Genealogy". The supply of the 1966 edition has long since been exhausted.

Great interest now centers not only on data on the latest generations, but also the need for further tracing out many many descendants of earlier generations whose records go no farther.

There will also be a change of format in the new edition, to make relationships and lines of descent easily traceable.

Your interest as a member and your pride in your Roger Williams ancestry leads us to believe you will want your own name and your complete family record to appear in the new edition. A family record sheet is enclosed for your use. Request as many more as you need for the families of your own offspring, and for families of earlier generations that you know were omitted, or whose records can be enlarged.

A lineage chart is enclosed. As a member, we already have your completed one on file. You may be able to make amendments on this one, or you may see fit to pass it along to a related descendant of Roger Williams. Again, request as many more as you need, or give us addresses of those to whom we should send them direct.

We plan to include in the new edition all individuals whose lineage has been traced back to Roger Williams. We invite and encourage membership in the Association but do not make it a prerequisite for a descendant's name to appear in the book.

May we count on your help in this project? We endourage prompt replies, but not at the expense of careful compilation of all the data you can reasonably gather from sources that are authoritative (public records, family Bibles, other genealogies, church and cemetery regards, etc.)

Modern roads and electrical lines were the culprits, with the result that the once magnificent tree is now deceased. This next year we are planning to re-dedicate another tree in a different location, possibly at which time we plan to re-dedicate the original bronze plaque.
